

CHILD NEGLECT

COURSE CONTENT OVERVIEW

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This Child Neglect training course aims to help professionals who work with children, young people and/or their families understand more about neglect and the impact it has on a child's life.

The course explains what neglect actually is, why it may occur, and the effects it has on a child's physical and mental health and wellbeing. Throughout the training, learners will understand how to recognise the most common warning signs that indicate neglect is taking place, and will know how to respond appropriately to any concerns about child abuse and neglect.

This module outlines what is meant by the term 'neglect' and details the different types of neglect that a child may experience. The module uses the example of Khyra Ishaq to highlight the importance of recognising neglect and responding to concerns.
