Dyslexia Awareness

This Dyslexia Awareness course will provide you with an awareness of how dyslexia impacts on children's learning and day-to-day life. It offers insight into what dyslexia is and isn't and looks at how you can support children with it.

It will strengthen your understanding of a learning difficulty which affects ten percent of the population and give you the confidence to help individuals with dyslexia to succeed.
