

This FGM, Forced Marriage, and Honour-Based Violence Awareness course has been designed to give learners an understanding of the causes and triggers of honour-based violence, forced marriage, and FGM.

This course will be appropriate for front line workers like police, health and social care, and education sector workers and anyone else looking to gain a cultural understanding of these abuses and gain knowledge of basic safeguarding and legal duties.

Module One: Introduction

The first module in this course introduces learners to 'violence against women' a category of gender-based violence that honour-based violence, FGM, and forced marriage fall into. This will introduce learners to the issues of gender-based violence that happen globally and discuss the United Nations initiative to end violence against women. The topics are:

Module Two: Forced Marriage

In this module, you'll learn the difference between a forced marriage and an arranged marriage. You'll learn about the immense social pressure that victims are under by their families and communities, and you'll learn the essential dos and don'ts that can prevent someone from being forced into a marriage. Module Three: Honour-Based Violence

Module Four: Female Genital Mutilation

In this module, you'll be introduced to FGM. You'll discover why it happens, who practices it and what the different types of mutilation there are. You'll also find out what the warning signals are that indicate that someone could be at risk as well as learning at what time of life women and girls are most at risk. You'll also learn about your legal duties to report known cases of FGM and how to help someone who is at risk. The full list of topics are:
