

County Lines is a form of criminal exploitation in which illegal drugs are transported from one area to another by children or adults at risk and over 27,000 children are involved in the United Kingdom (UK). County Lines affects all communities, and anyone can be coerced into being involved. Therefore, it is important that people are aware of County Lines and know how to identify if someone is being exploited.

This course will help those working with children, young people and adults at risk understand more about what County Lines is and how they operate, including who is at risk and how to identify if someone is being exploited. Learners will understand the different ways someone can become involved and the impact it has, as well as how to support individuals that have been affected by County Lines. The course also teaches learners the importance of early intervention and prevention, and how to respond to disclosures and concerns.

Module One: Introduction to County Lines

This module outlines what County Lines is and its role in relation to other serious crimes, such as child criminal exploitation, child sexual exploitation, human trafficking and modern slavery. This module also covers who is at risk of exploitation, as well as the relevant legislation and guidance for County Lines.
